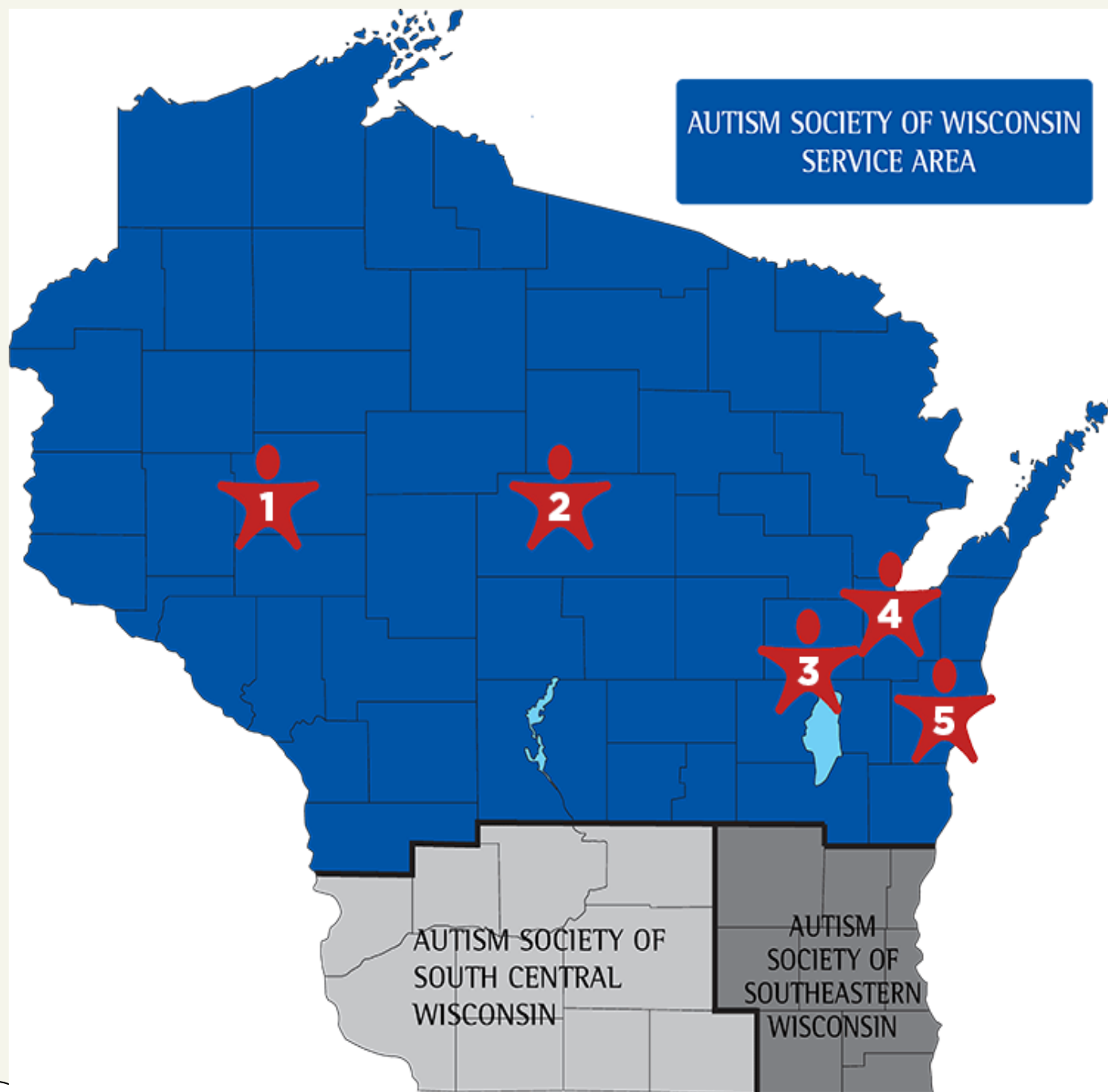

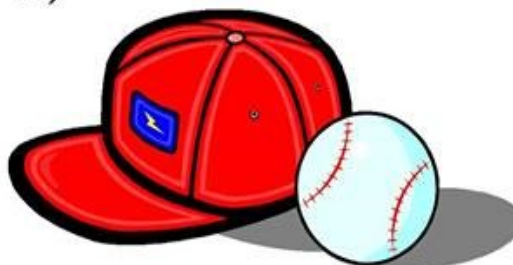

# STIMMI

This article is meant as an additional resource shared not an endorsement of the company.

*In German, the word for voice is “stimme”. We thought Stimmi was the perfect name for our company because Germany was the place where Deb’s son became non-verbal and later diagnosed with autism. This is the place where the journey began...*

*Deb and Laura are co-founders of Stimmi. As parent and professional, we have both seen the issues that happen when a disabled person is not able to express themselves. Parents want the best for their children, they fear “What happens to my child when I’m not there or if I am unable to care for them?” This is why we are so passionate about Stimmi. We created Stimmi to be a life plan to help those who are unable to care for themselves.*

Spring is a great time for you to learn about the MyStimmi Care Plan. Right now many of you are completing IEP planning, are thinking about summer plans or transitions in your loved ones life. Your son or daughter may be getting ready to graduate, transition into adult services or working with their birth to 3 programs. At MyStimmi.com you can replace the paper binders and notebooks with a personalized online care plan you create.

Because MyStimmi was created by a medical professional and a parent with a son who has autism great thought went into designing a flexible digital plan that takes all the information that YOU know and explains it to others. Additionally, it creates an online space where your care professionals can communicate with you, your loved one and each other. Because you invite them into the account, teachers, therapists, aides and other professionals can share information and communicate effectively. This eliminates confusion and streamlines communication.

It can take someone MONTHS to learn about your loved one. For example, by the time a teacher gets to know them – they are moving on to the next grade. With a MyStimmi Care Plan, they can read information and watch videos before they ever meet your loved one. This gives everyone a leg up and eliminates frustrations for your child/adult. Now you can outline behaviors, triggers, safety issues, and strategies to help an individual cope and be successful. Explain their routines and health, wellness and dietary issues to help with consistency of care. . Share your videos that SHOW how to provide support and care for your loved one. This gets everyone up to speed faster and promotes a good communication and a culture of safety.



## How MyStimmi benefits families:

Helps those caring and working with your child understand “who” they are and how to care for them

Replaces binders, files or folders and gives you a more efficient and manageable solution

Stores important documents such as insurance information, guardian paperwork, IEP's in a secure-password protected website. This information is then available on your phone or computer 24/7 when you need it.

Provides your Care Team a training tool and provides consistency of care for your loved one.

Creates peace of mind knowing you have a plan of action in the event you are unavailable or unable to care for your child

Includes parents/guardians in the Care Team communication
