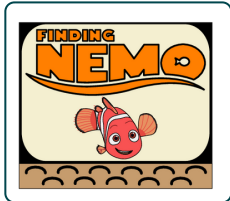


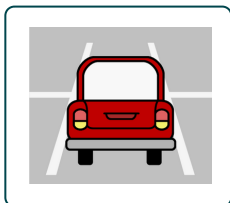
# Finding Nemo Jr: What to Expect



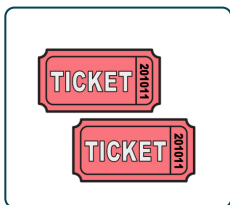
The play I will see is Finding Nemo Jr.

We will walk inside to the lobby.

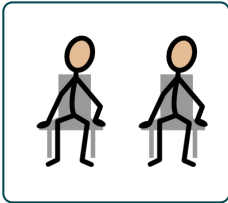
We will show the workers our tickets.

They will give us a packet with information about the play and the actors.

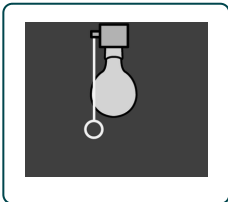


I can walk around the lobby, find the bathrooms, and walk inside the theater before the show starts.

# Finding Nemo Jr: What to Expect



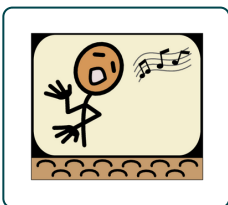
When the show starts, we have to sit in our seats.

There will be music, dancing, and singing.



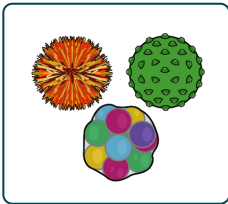
Some actors might walk through the aisles.

People will clap their hands to say "good job."

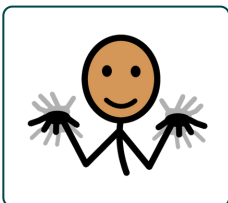
# Finding Nemo Jr: What to Expect



If it's too loud, I can cover my ears or use noise-cancelling headphones.



I can use my sensory tools like fidgets, squishies, or a device as long as it stays on silent.



I can bounce in my chair, tap my feet, and clap or flap my hands - as long as I'm not too loud.



If I need a break, I can ask to go to the break space.



When I'm ready, I can go back to my seat and finish watching the play.

# Finding Nemo Jr: What to Expect



Everyone will get a break during half-time or intermission. The lights will turn on. Some people will stay in their seats. Others will go to the lobby.



They might use the bathroom.  
They might buy a snack from the snack sale to eat.



Then, the show will start again. We will return to our seats. The lights will go off, and everyone will be quiet.



At the end of the play, the actors will all return to the stage to take a "bow" and be celebrated. People will clap to say "good job."



After the play people will leave their seats and go to the lobby. Some people will leave, and others will stay and take pictures or say "good job" to the actors.
